Together we have named this initiative the <u>Clean Air Mississippi Project (CAMP)</u>.

The greenhouse gas reduction measures identified as priorities will be proposed for incorporation into the Priority Climate Action Plan, which is due to the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) on March 1, 2024. The priority measures are being developed as part of the CAMP and identify main sources of Mississippi's air pollution and potential reduction measures. You are invited to give input on the measures before they are incorporated into the final Priority Climate Actin Plan.

Through CAMP we will prioritize emission reduction ideas and prepare our tribe and state to apply for clean air project implementation funding. Let us hear your ideas for improving air quality!
